## IPC PATHWAY CLASS

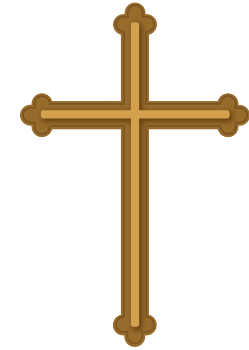
