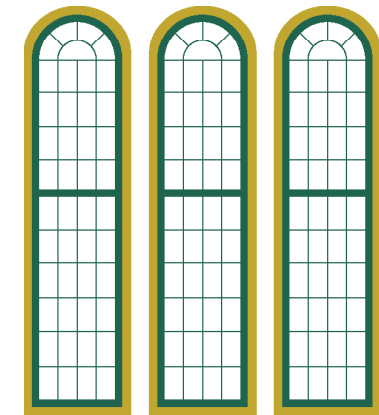
PROMOTION SUNDAY
