



As we return to Mark's Gospel, we have three short scenes that prepare us for Jesus' own proclamation of the Gospel in Mark 1:15. We need this preparation — because the central question that this Gospel asks us over and over again is "Who do you say I am?" (Mark 8:29). We've already heard Mark's answer in the very first verse: Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, the Divine King. But he wants us to answer that question as well, because if we come to the same conclusion, then Jesus is the Gospel of God, and he is the good news whom we must trust in order to be rescued from ourselves.

Our service this morning reminds us that this new year promises us a new beginning. But it is a new beginning only because God is present and is at work in our midst. He is the one who is "doing a new thing," as our call to worship tells us. He is the one who "blots out your transgressions," as our assurance of pardon reminds us. He is the one who "fully paid for all my sins with his precious blood," as the statement of faith tells us. God in Jesus by the Spirit: the Triune God is the one whom we worship this morning. And he offers us grace and peace — will you receive it? Will you receive him?
