THE FIRST WORD ON WORSHIP

This morning, we continue to study Habakkuk, and we come to these five woes that God pronounces against Babylon in 2:6-20. Although God was using the Babylonians to punish and purify his people, that did not mean that God's moral compass was undone. Rather, he will set the world to rights again — he will bring punishment upon the Babylonians for their sins. We must never forget, and we must earnestly believe that God is in his holy temple — he is ruling over his world for his own glory.

Isn't it the case, then, that the Scriptures continue to teach us what we are to believe concerning God? That's what our statement of faith, Westminster Shorter Catechism Q3, tells us: our God continues to rule over his world for his glory. Though the wrong seems off so strong, our God and Father is the ruler yet. And so, as we come into God's holy temple, we see him on his throne; we worship and adore him; we confess our sins and seek him while he might be found; and above all, we give him his due: praise and rejoicing that our God reigns!
