THE FIRST WORD ON WORSHIP

Having just heard that there are two ways to live, Paul moves in Romans 8:12-13 to apply that to our lives. Since we have been placed in the pathway of the Spirit to walk in step with the Spirit, we no longer owe sin anything. Instead, we have an obligation to live by the Spirit — and that looks like putting to death (the old language is “mortifying”) our sinful thoughts, words, and deeds, and delighting in Christ.

Corporate worship helps us with this very thing. As we come into God’s presence and use the ordinary means of grace, God shapes our hearts so that we are more eager to say no to our sinful patterns and to say yes to God’s Word and way. After all, his steadfast love and surpassing power toward us who believe is evident over and over in Jesus Christ. Most obviously, God’s love and power draw out our confession of sin and assure us that we are new creations — the new has come to us by the power of God’s Spirit. So, let us rejoice and be glad! Our God shows us his great love today as he points us to all that he is for us!

THE STATEMENT OF FAITH

Heidelberg Catechism, Lord's Day 4

The Leader: But doesn't God do us an injustice by requiring in his law what we are unable to do?

The Congregation: No, God created human beings with the ability to keep the law. They, however, provoked by the devil, in willful disobedience, robbed themselves and all their descendants of these gifts.

The Leader: Does God permit such disobedience and rebellion to go unpunished?

The Congregation: Certainly not. God is terribly angry with the sin we are born with as well as the sins we personally commit. As a just judge, God will punish them both now and in eternity, having declared: "Cursed is everyone who does not observe and obey all the things written in the book of the law."
