THE FIRST WORD ON WORSHIP

This morning, we pick back up in Mark's Gospel and will remain here until we finish the book on Easter Sunday. Mark 13 is one of the more difficult passages in the entire Gospel; it has its parallel in Matthew 24. Here we find Jesus speaking in two directions: he is talking about the destruction of Jerusalem, and he is talking about his return in power and glory. And yet sometimes it is difficult to discern which part is addressing which point. In the end, what we need to take away from this is hope: Jesus is coming again; he will return with power and glory; he will judge the nations and set his world to rights again.

In the light of this, our call to worship from Isaiah 41 is a great word of comfort: "Fear not!" As we live in this "mean meantime," this time between Jesus' first and second coming, we may wonder whether the promises are true, whether Jesus will return and set his world to rights. He comes to us reminding us that he is our faithful Shepherd, the one who has given us the right to become children of God, the one who invites us to hope in him even as our worlds seem to be crumbling around us. May God draw your heart to Jesus so that you will hear his Word: "Fear not!"
