## THE FIRST WORD ON WORSHIP

As we look at this final section in Mark 13, we see that Jesus is picking up the other part of the disciples' question. In verses 1-23, he answered their question about "when these things will be," when would the holy temple and the holy city be destroyed. But in our text this morning, he answers the second part of their question, "What will be the sign when all these things are about to be accomplished?" Jesus is separating things that they have put together — the end of the temple is not the end of the world; rather, Jesus himself will come again in power and glory to end human history. And the call for every disciple is to stay awake, be ready, be on the alert, looking for the master's return.

Such hope and confidence that Jesus is coming again shapes our service this morning. Psalm 47 calls us to worship, urging us to shout to the Lord with a loud voice full of praise. This King who has gone up with glory will come again the same way — with great glory. Since we serve such a glorious King, it is right for us to confess our sins; after all, he is both judge and advocate, both priest and sacrifice, the one who pardons all our sins through his own bloody death on the cross. And he continues to rule his world through his decrees of creation and providence — there is coming a day when the governor of all things shall return again. And we say, "Maranatha! Come, Lord Jesus!"

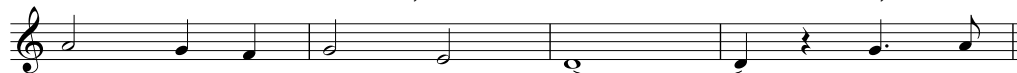
