A NEW PEOPLE. A NEW MEMPHIS.

As we worship God together on this Sabbath Day, we do so under the rule of the “Lord of the Sabbath.” That’s what our sermon text tells us — that Jesus is Lord of the Sabbath and that he has this role as “the Son of Man,” the one who has been granted ruling authority by the Ancient of Days. As we explore these two final scenes in the account of escalating conflict between the Pharisees and Jesus, notice how Jesus continually presses who he is and what he has come to do. He leaves us in little doubt that he makes forthright claims as the Son of God and the Son of David to be the Messiah himself.

As a result, it is right for us to come to worship God the Father through Jesus his Son by the Holy Spirit. Our call to worship this morning comes from Psalm 24 and we sing that section together. We gain a foretaste of glory, the eternal Sabbath, now as we worship together— Christ comes to his people, the Lord of glory himself. We come tired of our sins, confess them, and hear that Jesus gives us soul-rest and easy-yoke. We see how he shepherds us through the baptism of our covenant children — the Gospel promises are held out to us when we are weak and helpless. Surely, God loves us first, anyway, and always! And as we hear the benediction, we are reminded of the presence of our God who comes to us through Jesus’ own Spirit. What grace comes to us Lord’s Day by Lord’s Day as we worship!
