THE FIRST WORD ON WORSHIP

We come back this morning to Romans 8, and we find that in the midst of our suffering, we have a great ally, a helper: the Holy Spirit himself. And so, we begin to see how this chapter really is a chapter all about the Holy Spirit. He is the one who set us free from the power of sin and death; he is the one who sets us on a new path; he is the one who is the power, enabling us to say no to sin and yes to delight in God; he is the one who assures our hearts that we are God's child; and now we see how he is the one who helps us in our weakness and articulates our prayers before the Father.

Our service this morning works with these themes of the Holy Spirit's work in our life and our God as a helper to his people. Whether in the call to worship, which reminds us that the Spirit sheds his love abroad in our hearts; in the assurance of pardon, which reminds us that Jesus is our great helper and advocate with the Father; in our songs and prayers, which remind us that our God is our great helper in times of trouble; or in the ministry of the Word and the table, where the Spirit is the one who takes his Word and applies it to our hearts — over and over we see how our God, Father, Son, and Spirit, comes to us, meets us, shapes us, and renews us to follow him!






