FIRST WORD ON WORSHIP

This morning, we join Jesus on the “via dolorosa.” The Via Dolorosa, which literally means “way of pain,” is a processional route in Jerusalem that is believed to be the path that Jesus walked on his way to the crucifixion. There is a sense in which these first verses in Mark 14 are the beginning of that path, a stage of preparation in which we meet key protagonists in the drama, but we also see Jesus clearly: who he is and what he has come to do. As we progress over the next several weeks to Calvary and the Garden Tomb, we will enter fully into the wonder of the Gospel. Let’s pray together that Jesus, his cross, and the redemption he secured for us will become bigger, loom larger, and transform us more fully!

God’s Word calls us to worship Jesus by fixing our eyes upon him. Hebrews 12:1-2 reminds us that Jesus despised the shame and scorn of the cross that we might become God’s own — we were part of the joy that was set before Jesus! How wonderful — and how much we need to wonder at it! As we confess our sins and hear God’s Word assuring us that we have a great high priest who made propitiation for us, as we participate in Word and sacrament and pray, may God fix our eyes on Jesus only, losing sight of all beside!




