## THE FIRST WORD ON WORSHIP

Last Sunday, we began walking with Jesus down the Via Dolorosa, which literally means “the way of sorrows.” That name describes a two thousand foot stretch of road in Old Jerusalem that ostensibly is the path that Jesus walked from Pilate’s judgment hall to Golgotha. But we are using it to chart the pathway — and the stations along the way — where Jesus endured his final humiliation for our salvation. This morning, that journey will take us to the Passover.

Because Jesus endures all this humiliation for our salvation — especially, the humiliation of death on the Cross and burial in a tomb — our service this morning focuses especially on what Jesus’ death means. Our call to worship from Revelation 1 tells us that Jesus made us a kingdom of priests by his blood. Our hymns focus us on the Cross of Jesus, what he suffered and endured for us. And God’s Word, from the assurance of pardon through the ministry of the Word, reminds us of God’s great love for us displayed in the Cross of Jesus. May God meet you and remind you of his great love and compassion for you, evidenced through so great a salvation!

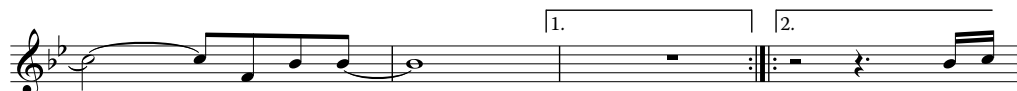

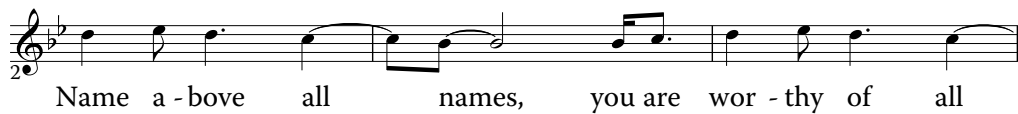

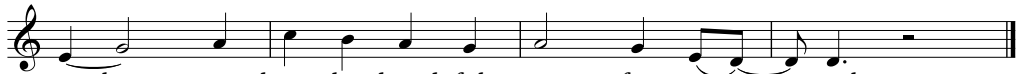
