The apologist C. S. Lewis once observed that there was a basic trilemma that Jesus presents to us. He is either a liar — telling falsehoods to gain a following; a lunatic — making claims that only a madman would make; or he is whom he actually claimed to be: the Lord, the Messiah, the Son of God. Our text this morning presents this trilemma: through the reactions of Jesus' family and the Pharisees, we see those who thought he was a lunatic or a liar. But in the faith of his followers, his new Israel, his true family, we find those who recognize him as Lord. The question this portion of Mark asks us: who do *you* say that Jesus is?

As his followers, we say that he is the Lord who loves us and to whom we respond in love. God's Word calls us to worship this morning from Psalm 18. God always gets the first word in our worship services. His word of grace is always "prevenient," going before us. We don't initiate relationship with God; rather, he loves us first, moves toward us first, and calls us first. We respond this morning with praise, but also with confession, recognizing all the ways we sin against this divine love. But we have confidence that our Savior, the God-man, is able and willing to rescue us. The catechism questions from the New City Catechism, a recent short summary of the classic Reformed catechisms, helps us affirm once again that Jesus is able to sympathize, intercede, and rescue because he is our Lord! Thanks be to God!




