THE FIRST WORD ON WORSHIP

The next station on the Via Dolorosa brings us to the Sanhedrin itself, where Jesus is condemned. Here we see the wonder of the Gospel: that, in my place, condemned he stood. For, of course, Jesus was falsely condemned. The entire trial was a sham and ironically, the basis upon which the high priest announced Jesus' condemnation was actually the Great Confession — for Jesus truly is the Son of God who will be revealed in glory and power.

As we consider once again the wonder of the Gospel, God's Word calls us to worship him using the words from Psalm 34. As we magnify the Lord's name together, as we taste and see that he is good, we confess that we are sinners who deserve the Lord's condemnation. Yet the Gospel meets us with the promise that Jesus stood in our place, the righteous suffering for the unrighteous, so that we might be set free. All along this Via Dolorosa, we see how it is that Jesus accomplishes our salvation. It should stir our hearts to wonder, love, and praise!






VOLUNTEERS NEEDED FOR CITY CAMP IN NEW YORK
