FIRST WORD ON WORSHIP

We return this morning to the Via Dolorosa, following Jesus on the way to Golgotha, and we find ourselves in Pilate's Judgment Hall. It is striking that, in the Apostles' Creed, there are only two persons mentioned other than the Father, Son, Spirit: Mary and Pilate. In some ways, those two names serve as bookends to Jesus' life and purpose — Mary, Jesus' mother, reminds us of his incarnation; Pilate, Jesus' judge, reminds us of his redemption. As we see the interplay between guilt and innocence, may God drive our hearts to the Cross as the example of God's great love for us.

The shape of our worship service reminds us of this Gospel by representing it to us. Our call to worship and our assurance of pardon from Isaiah 53 helps us interpret the scenes that we find in Mark's Gospel. As we confess our sins, we freely admit that we are the ones who deserve God's condemnation; as we confess our faith, we boldly declare that our God, Father, Son, and Spirit, is the one who has worked for us and our salvation. And as we hear God's final good words in the benediction, we remember that God's shalom was gained for us through the death of Christ on the cross. May God meet with us as we worship him this day!






