A NEW PEOPLE. A NEW MEMPHIS.

This week's text is the first of three that ask the question, "What obeys Jesus?" But in answering this question, there is a deeper question underlying each of these texts, one that the disciples ask: "Who then is this?" (4:41). As I've been suggesting to you, that is the question with which Mark continues to confront us. Because if Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, then we have to do something with him — either bow the knee to him, rest our hearts in him, or run from him in rebellion. There is no such thing as banal neutrality when it comes to Jesus. If Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, the only real question is, "Do you obey him?"

The background to our text is found in Psalm 107. That psalm serves as our call to worship as the redeemed of the Lord testify to his goodness in rescuing us from storm, wind, and waves. As we sing God's praise this morning, let us be mindful: singing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs only benefits us if our minds and our hearts are engaged. All too often, we sing the words and the notes and realize at the end of the song we weren't really paying attention. Let's ask God this morning to engage us — body and soul, mind, and heart — so that we might see him in his glory and know him in his goodness.




