THE FIRST WORD ON WORSHIP

This morning we start our morning sermon series that will take us through all of May, June, and July. We will be focused on the so-called Songs of Ascent, Psalms 120-134. This collection within the Old Testament psalter is quite diverse, but they are linked together under this heading because they were songs that were sung as pilgrims made their way to Jerusalem for worship. As they literally ascended the holy hill to Zion from all over Israel, these songs expressed their hearts' desire. These psalms provide a playlist for us as well, pilgrims in this weary land who are making our own way to Zion.

And these are songs that we should teach to the next generation, as Psalm 78 reminds us in our call to worship. Our deep longing is that our covenant children will join us on pilgrimage, professing faith in Jesus and pledging to be his disciples. As we pray and labor to that end, we also beg the Holy Spirit to cause all of us to find our refuge in our faithful Advocate, Jesus Christ. He is the Righteous One, whose blood atones for all our sins. Thanks be to God for our faithful Savior, Jesus Christ!
