THE FIRST WORD ON WORSHIP

This past week I was in Montana, and I was introduced to Aspen trees. I have always heard of their beauty, and I have ever had in the back of my mind that there are unique characteristics of Aspen trees. I have never understood their unique traits until recently. For example, a grouping of fifty (50) to one-hundred and fifty (150) is not known as a grove — rather, as a colony of trees. Why? Because all of the Aspens, in a colony, are connected by one intricate underground root system that feeds and nourishes all of the trees of that particular colony. Additionally, each new Aspen is essentially an outgrowth of the commonly shared underground root system. Consequently, all of the Aspens co-located in a colony are inextricably connected and find that their birth, growth, life, and death is tied to an ecosystem that is fortified and strengthened by an intricate and common root system.

What are the lessons for us as we take an in-depth look into Psalm 132? Stated, as Christians, we are rooted in the Lord Jesus, and we find nourishment, strength, health, and stability in him alone. Our union with Jesus informs our being rooted in Christ (Galatians 2:20). This common rootedness is additionally illustrated by our worship of God as we apply the promises of God to our heads, hearts, and hands. In brief, Psalm 132 is a compass in our lives that informs our unique identity as believers. I am looking forward to gathering with you in worship and discerning our calling in this life as we are commonly rooted in him.



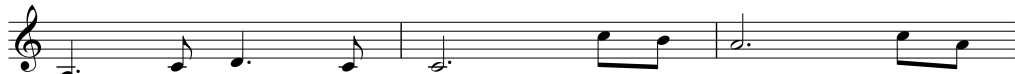

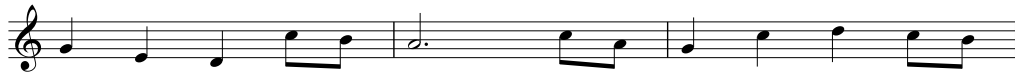
