



FIRST WORD FOR WORSHIP

For many of us, our morning text is extremely painful. None of us expect to divorce when we first get married; and every divorce has a painful story connected to it. Our temptation is to avoid texts like these simply to avoid the pain, guilt, and shame that comes from Jesus' words. But that would be a mistake — first, because God's design for marriage from the Garden of Eden on still stands. Second, it would be a mistake to avoid this text because it is within our marriages where we learn to deny ourselves, take our cross, and follow Jesus, where we learn the requisite humility to self-sacrificially serve another without expectation of reciprocity, without the other person deserving our service.

That's why Psalm 124 is so powerful for us: if the Lord had not been on our side, our fears, dangers, sin, guilt, shame would surely have swallowed us up alive! God's Word comes again and again to stir us, comfort us, shape us, and mold us. As we confess our sins, we discover that God himself promises to be our spouse in faithfulness, even when we have proven to be unfaithful time and again. And he points us forward to lives of chastity, but also to service to one who loved us to the cross and back. Thanks be to God!






