A NEW PEOPLE. A NEW MEMPHIS.

Our sermon text today, Revelation 8-9, tells us about the unfolding nature of God's judgment against the world. While there are parallels to what we saw with the seals in Revelation 6, there are differences as well. With the seals, there is a word of assurance to God's people that justice will come and wrongs will be made right; with the trumpet judgments, there is evidence that God's justice is coming and will come. But with these judgments, there is a larger purpose in mind: the repentance of the nations, which is not forthcoming and which confirms them in their own deserved condemnation.

And so, our worship service this morning follows this theme. Psalm 108 speaks to God's people and reminds them of God's steadfast love evidenced in their deliverance from his wrath. And yet, we are called to confess our sins, which we do with words adapted from a sixteenth century confession: we are reminded that we deserve God's wrath and curse, exactly as the Shorter Catechism teaches us. And yet, God's steadfast love to us in Jesus seeks our repentance and calls us to come to him. May God grant us grace to hear him calling us, to turn from our sin and to run to Jesus!

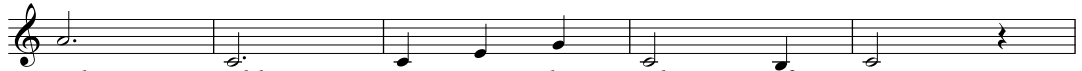

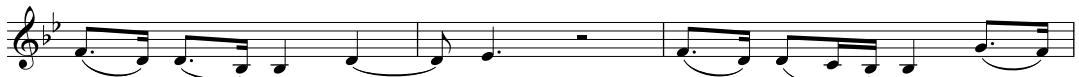
