THE FIRST WORD ON WORSHIP

As we continue in our series through the Letters of John, we are confronted with the question, “Do you love one another?” While John has stressed the practice of righteousness as a moral test to ascertain whether we are genuine followers of Jesus, he connects this practice of righteousness to the practice of loving others. In other words, the moral test is related to the social test. And if we have questions about what love is, we hear this word: “By this we know love, that he laid down his life for us, and we ought to lay down our lives for the brothers” (1 John 3:16).

It is because Jesus Christ laid down his life for us that we know God’s love and are able to praise God for that love. Our call to worship this morning reminds us that we are coming into the presence of a great King who showed his love for us in gaining great victories over our sin and shame. We are freed to confess those sins, knowing that his love provided a way of forgiveness — Jesus Christ, the atoning sacrifice for our sins. And we are moved to praise but also to serve others as a result. May God grant us his grace to worship our God and serve his people this day!
