## FIRST WORD FOR WORSHIP

I wonder if we have ever connected Jesus' blessing of the children with the scene of the rich young ruler. Likely not — and yet, there is a key theme that connects all of this together. What is necessary in order to enter the Kingdom of God (10:15, 23, 24, 25)? On the surface, infants have nothing to offer, while the rich young man has everything to offer. But Jesus tells us that those who have nothing gain everything, while those who have everything gain nothing. And in telling us this, he is reminding us of the basics of discipleship itself (see Mark 8:35-39).

As we come this morning, we do so as those who have nothing to offer the Triune God and yet who have received everything from him because he is the God of all grace. We declare his goodness with our call to worship from Psalm 145 and receive his goodness in the assurance of pardon from that same text. We affirm our faith with precious words and Gospel truths summarized in the Apostles' Creed. We see those in our midst who in professing their faith are declaring that they are forsaking all to gain Christ. And we have the joy of receiving a new pastor, Robert Browning, who will be installed during the 11 a.m. service. May God show his grace upon us so that we know how much we have gained through Jesus Christ!
