## FIRST WORD FOR WORSHIP

Why can't the disciples get it? Our text this morning contains the third and most detailed statement by Jesus concerning his suffering, death, and resurrection. And yet, the disciples seem like they don't hear Jesus at all — instead of considering the cross (the cup of suffering, the baptism of sorrow), they are focused on the crown; instead of pondering suffering, they are striving for significance; instead of looking at humiliation, they are longing for exaltation.

Of course, we are no different in the end. We want to be leaders with privilege and power, strength and authority; yet, Jesus comes to us and tells us to give our power and privilege away. In doing this, becoming the servant of all, we actually follow in the pathway of the Savior. In order for that to happen, we need the Holy Spirit to use his means of grace to reform us this morning. As God's Word meets us from the call to worship on, as we participate in the sacrament of baptism, as we pray, we are being shaped into those who follow the one who came not to be served, but to serve. May God do his work in us today!
