A NEW PEOPLE. A NEW MEMPHIS.

As we come to Revelation 13:1-14:5, we have to remember that this is part of a larger section that runs from Revelation 12-14. Once again, we are seeing this repetition of the history of the world between the two advents of Christ. But now, we gain some sense of how the dragon pursues God's people—he does so through the power of the state, which is given quasi-religious status in the mind of the masses. We might grow discouraged, faint and give up in the face of this opposition unless we remember whose and who we are: we belong to Christ, the King set on Zion's hill; and we are his fair army, who praise him with the new song of praise.

That's why the Redeemed of the Lord testify, as our call to worship from Psalm 107 asks us to do: we have learned the new song and fight the good fight through praise of our Christ. You'll notice that through the service in the hymn, "Come, Let Us Sing unto the Lord." That is a setting of Psalm 98 which explicitly refers to the "new song" that God's people learn to sing. As we sing that hymn in our ascription of praise and responses, may God grant us a heart full of joy as we testify to the world that we have been marked out by the blood of the Lamb for his service and glory!






