THE FIRST WORD ON WORSHIP

This morning we come to the end of this first letter that John wrote to his churches in Asia Minor; in November, we will look at 2 and 3 John and hear the questions that they too ask us. But this final text, 1 John 5:13-21, emphasizes the word “know” throughout its verses: seven times, the ESV has that word (5:13, 15 [2x], 18, 19, 20 [2x]). As he summarizes the themes from this letter, John wants to ask us, “What do you know?” If Christian assurance is about belief, it is not a faith apart from knowledge; rather, it is a certainty that what we know and believe is true — we’ve trusted “the true God and eternal life” (1 John 5:20).

Those who have trusted in this God are those who meditate on his Word, who are planted by rivers of water, and who bear fruit that lasts. That’s what our call to worship tells us from Psalm 1 — such grace comes to us in and through Jesus Christ. And the grace that calls us to worship is the grace that brings us to confess our sins. Yet our confession of sin is not fearful — rather, we hear God’s assurance of pardon: Jesus has died once for all for our sins to rescue us and sanctify us. As we put our trust in him, as we rest upon him and receive him, we find that Jesus is more than enough for all that we face in this life and the life to come. Praise the Lord!

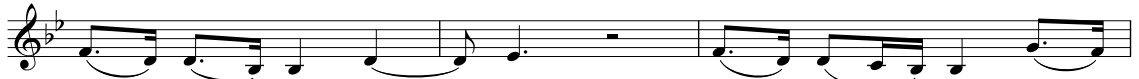

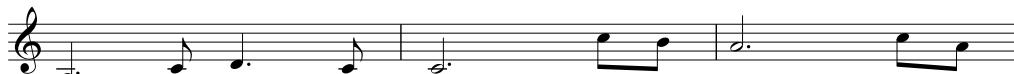

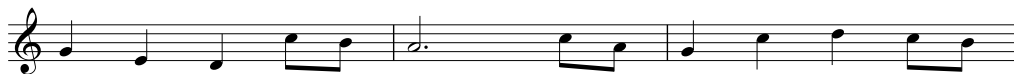
