THE FIRST WORD ON WORSHIP

Like this past week, so today: I doubt many of us have heard a sermon on 3 John. And like last week, so today: this little book has something to teach us about the Christian life. In many ways, all three of these letters that John wrote emphasize similar things — the Christian life is not only believing the right things (though it is that), but is also loving the right way. In this little letter, we will meet three men: one who loves well, one who loves less, and one who should be loved now for Jesus' sake.

God teaches us and forms us to live as his followers through his means of grace: today, as we hear his Word read and preached, as we confess what baptism means, as we participate in the Lord's Supper this evening, God forms us into new people who love one another well. And so, God calls us into his presence and teaches us to rejoice, for he is our salvation; we confess our sins and hear that God so loved the world that he gave his Son for our salvation; and we pray to and praise this God of love who sets us free to love well. May God make us into his new people for his glory this day!

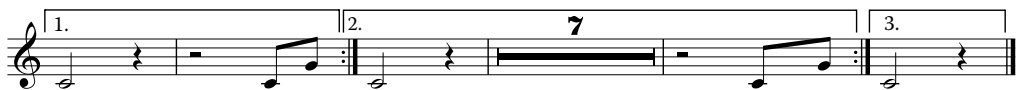

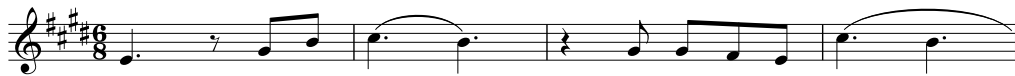
